The Easy-Access Information Directory Identifies Services that provide help and advice for people who are socially disadvantaged, or excluded.

Types of Services include :

- Emergency Need,
- Someone to speak up / advocate for you.
- Legal advice.
- Help with debt and welfare rights problems.
- Help in recovery from addiction problems.
- Help with adult and specialist learning.
- Help with finding accommodation
- Help with mental health problems.
- Health and fitness programmes.
- Help for people fleeing violence.
- Specialist help in dealing with young people older people, women's groups, ethnic minority and refugee issues.

Services are identified as those who accept self referral or those requiring a referral from social work or other services

The Information is provided in digital formats which can be easily used and understood by both service users and service providers.

The Directory has individual pages of information on each service and is constantly being checked and updated.

Service Users need an easy to use , up-to-date, accurate source of information on support services that can help them with their recovery from a range of social problems .

This Directory has been put together, is designed by and is constantly updated by service user volunteers/peer researchers to make it universally useful for both service users and service providers.

Started as a guide to services providing help for people experiencing homelessness it became obvious that all forms of social deprivation and exclusion are almost inextricably linked and that to continue a recovery people may have to use different services types at different stages of recovery to increase their chances of a positive outcome .
